

Jyotin Gor named overall champion

Jyotin Gor was named as the best overall champion in the stableford format at the Kensville Amateur Challenge. Playing with a handicap of 14, Gor scored 41 points to beat Niraj Kapur (40 points) by a point for the title at Kensville Golf Club on Sunday.

Meanwhile, in a battle of promising youngsters, Varun Parikh overcame challenges from Anshul Mehta and Kairav Shah to shoot three birdies to total 5 over par and carded with the best gross score.

Playing a steady round of golf, Reenu Nirwani shot 37 points to win in the ladies category while Hetal Patel came second with 34 points.

Siddharth Naik won the 0-14 handicap category with 36 points while Munish Patell was the runner-up with 34 points.

It was an interesting tie in 15-28 handicap category with both Pravit Parikh and Pranav Kapadia were tied at 38 points. The two were tied even on the countback of last nine holes. Finally, Pravit was declared winner on the countback of last three holes. It was a similar story in the junior category also with both Mohnish Shah and Aaradhana Vaghela tied at 17 points. Mohnish was, however, declared winner on the basis of countback. Aaradhana returned with a special prize as she became the only junior to hit a birdie.

Meanwhile, in the skills prizes, Sameer Sinha won the longest drive title with a shot of 251 yards while Tushar Shah shot closest to the pin.
