

Siddikur leads the charge

iddikur Rahman is living a dream. From a ball boy to a caddie and then to an Asian Tour title in 2010, it seems Bangladeshi golfer can't put a foot wrong on the golf course these days.

And Siddikur has got off to a rousing start in the Kensville Gujarat Challenge 2011 at the Kensville golf course.

lenge 2011 at the Kensville golf course. On Thursday, Siddikur shot a flaw-less five-under 67 to take a two-shot lead at the end of the first round in the

200,000 euros worth maiden Euro-pean Challenge Tournament in India. Ricardo Santos, Florian Praegant and Daniel Denison chased the leader with an identical round of three-un-der 69.

Leading the Indian charge was Gaganjeet Bhullar, who shot a two-under par 70 to be tied for the fifth position along with Espen Kofstad, Mads Vibe-Hastrup and Klas Eriksson.

The Bangladeshi had the privilege of playing two practice rounds apart from the Pro-Am seemed at Kensville before the European Challenge got undeway on Thursday. "I was putting well. There were no
bogeys. I was also hitting well on this
beautiful golf course," said Siddikur after completing his first round.
Siddikur, who used to stay near the
Kurmitola golf course in Dhaka was a
ball boy in his school boys. He later

Because of his keen interest in the game, the golf club allowed him to play at the golf course. And there has been no stopping the golfer since then. Siddikur won his maiden amateur title at the age of 20. He won his first title on Asian Tour, when he cap-tured the Brunei Open last August.
